Petrol station cashier jailed 15 months for RM9,800 CBT

KUCHING: A woman was jailed for 15 months yesterday after pleading guilty at the Sessions Court here yesterday to committing criminal breach of trust (CBT) involving RM9,800 belonging to a petrol station.

Hanis Shila Mandi, 24, entered the plea after the charge under Section 408 of the Penal Code was read to her before Judge Noorhisham Mohd Jaafar.

According to the charge, the accused, who worked as a cashier entrusted with the company's sales proceeds, committed CBT when she failed to deposit RM9,800 into the company's account.

The offence was committed between 9.25am and noon at a petrol station along Mile 12, Jalan Kuching-Serian on Dec 8, 2025.

Based on the facts of the case, the company's manager discovered that the total collection for the accused's shift from 6am to 2pm on the day of the incident amounted to

RM17,261.60.

However, the complainant found that only RM7,341.60 had been deposited into the cash deposit machine, a shortfall of RM9,800.

Following this, the complainant reviewed closed-circuit television (CCTV) recordings which showed the accused taking cash from the drawer.

The CCTV footage also showed the accused carrying out bank-in transactions between 10am and 12.30pm.

Acting on a police report lodged, police arrested Hanis on Jan 22 this year.

Investigations revealed she had used the money to repay a loan she had taken out online.

The accused also failed to return the money, either partially or in full.

The prosecution was handled by deputy public prosecutor Adriana Maisarah Mohd Farid, while the accused did not have legal representation.
