Guided by AI, court sentences man to nine
months' jail for drug possession

MIRI: The Magistrates' Court here yesterday sentenced a man to nine months in prison for possessing illicit drugs, guided

by a recommendation from the Artificial Intelligence (AI) system in place.

Freddy convicted Liong Jia Lun, 32, from Jalan Palma, RPR Batu

32, from Jaian Palma, RPR Batu 6 here on his own guilty plea to a charge under Section 12(2) of

the Dangerous Drugs Act 1952, punishable under Section 12(3) of the same Act. The Section provides for up to five years' imprisonment

or a fine not exceeding RM100,000, or both, upon conviction. "After considering several

"After considering several aspects, including the accused's guilty plea, facts of the case, seriousness of the offence, and taking into account public interest and sentence recommended by the AI system, the accused is sentenced to nine

months' imprisonment," said the

magistrate.

Courts in Sarawak started using AI for sentencing recommendation in April 2020.
