

Man jailed 14 days, fined for injuring brother's girlfriend with handphone

SIBU: A man who injured his brother's girlfriend by hurling a mobile phone at her was yesterday jailed for 14 days and fined RM2,000 in default a month in prison.

Magistrate Oon Kork Chern ordered Lee Leong Chiu, 46, to serve his imprisonment from the date of his arrest on Feb 28, 2026.

Lee had earlier pleaded guilty to a charge of voluntarily causing hurt to the 37-year-old woman at a house on Lorong 14, Brooke Drive here at about 5pm on Feb 28.

The charge was framed under Section 324 of the Penal Code, which provides for up to 10 years' jail or a fine or whipping, or any two of such punishments, upon conviction.

According to the facts of the

case, the woman was at her boyfriend's house when the accused, who is the boyfriend's younger brother, acted aggressively and hurled a mobile phone at her face, causing an injury to her chin.

Lee also attempted to punch her but was restrained by his brother and their mother.

Acting on a report filed by the woman, police arrested Lee at the house at around 8.15pm the same day.

Investigations revealed that the incident was triggered after the woman and her boyfriend advised the accused to stop abusing drugs.

Deputy public prosecutor Keshava Rao Tharma Raja handled the prosecution, while the accused was unrepresented.
